This Week at Providence

We were thankful for the opportunity to hold Parent-Teacher Conferences this past week. About 40% of families attended, and the conversations were rich, encouraging, and productive. These conferences provide a meaningful way to strengthen the partnership between home and school, ensuring that we are working together to support students in their learning and growth. As a parental Christian school, this collaboration is a key part of who we are, and conferences are an invaluable opportunity to invest in that relationship. On Wednesday, our school assembly was a time of reflection and encouragement. Course Updates

Grade 9

Bible 9 – Mrs. Vandermeyden: We are learning about God's faithfulness to the Israelites through Genesis and Exodus. We will have a test on Units 2 and 3 on Thursday, March 27. Don't forget to complete your creative response over the March break!

Geography 9 – Mr. Pennings: We have finished the second unit about the interrelationship between physical and human geography. The original plan was to write the test on Friday, but the snow day messed up the schedule. This test will need to be written after the March Break. The next unit of study will be Canadian Resources and Industries.

Healthy Active Living 9 – Mrs. Van Wynsberghe: We are finishing our first health unit on health and safety. Our test for this unit will be on Thursday, March 20.

Mathematics 9 – Mrs. Xu: We will continue studying Chapter 3, and a project will be assigned to allow you to demonstrate your understanding of key concepts. A brief presentation will be scheduled afterward. Please ensure your notebook is well-organized, and all answers are written neatly with detailed solutions.

Grade 10

Bible 10 – Miss Averink: We've completed Unit 2 of the course and will move to studying Creeds and Confession post-Reformation. We will be learning about Robert's Rules and look forward to having Reverend Sinke in our class to lead a Mock Classis activity after the break. I hope every student has a great March break!

Bible 10 - Mr. Pennings: We have finished the second unit about the counter-reformation. The original plan was to write the test on Friday, but the snow day messed up the schedule. This test will need to be written after the March Break. The next unit of study will be Creeds, Confessions and Heresy of the Reformation.

Canadian History 10P – Mrs. Pieterman: Students are using their research skills and concepts of historical thinking knowledge to research significant battles of World War I. Each student will create an informative poster of their assigned battle to inform their classmates about it during a Museum Gallery Walk. We'll complete this walk on the Monday after the break. Our field trip to the RCR Museum is Tuesday, March 18. Enjoy your March Break, everyone!

Canadian History 10D – Miss Averink: With completion of Unit 2 today, we're moving towards Unit 3 which will focus on the Roaring Twenties and Dirty Thirties. Students have a "Letter from the Trenches" assignment due on Thursday, March 20th. Enjoy the break!

French 10 – Miss Hiemstra: We've continued working on our resumes and cover letters this week; final drafts will be due Tuesday, March 18, at which time students will also be doing an oral assessment (via an interview with Miss Hiemstra) as part of their culminating project for this unit. We've learned the conditional present tense this week and reviewed some of the other tenses we've learned since the beginning of the course. When we get back from March Break, we'll continue to learn vocabulary and verb tenses that will help students communicate about their careers and interests.

Information & Communication Technology 10 – Mrs. Pieterman: This week we discussed various sources students use for research and rated the credibility and academic reliability of several websites. Students learned how to navigate online research databases using their Middlesex County library cards (available for free to every student at PRC!). We'll review the formatting requirements of APA citation, and then after the break we'll move into a culminating research assignment. Enjoy a restful March Break!

Mathematic 10D – Mrs. VanWynsberghe: We are wrapping up our second unit with our test planned for Wednesday March 19. Our Chapter problem for Unit 2 will be due on Thursday, March 20.

Mathematic 10P – Miss Hiemstra: We've learned three methods of solving linear systems: graphing, substitution, and elimination. When we get back from March Break, we'll review these methods, look at some applications of learning how to solve linear systems, and begin reviewing for our Unit 3 Test. This test will take place on Friday, March 21. Our Unit 3 project will be due Monday, March 24.

Grade 11 and 12

Advanced Functions 12U- Mr. Ellens: We plan on reviewing on Monday the 17th and having a test on Tuesday the 18th.

Art II- Mrs. Bergsma: The Chinese snuff pots and artist statements were handed in on Friday. We continued to work on our macrame knots, and the students started their macrame pot hangers. Girls, please work on your hangers over the break, maybe even write your artist statement ahead of time, and work on your portfolios! Hope you have a great time away.

Bible 12 – Mr. Vander Deen: This past week, students completed a test on Romans 1-3. We then spent time preparing Romans 3-8 presentations, which students will begin presenting on Monday when we return. After the

presentations, we will take a closer look at the freedom we have in Christ (Romans 7-8) before turning to the question of Israel's rejection and restoration (Romans 9-11).

Calculus and Vectors 12U - Mr. Ellens: We will be working on finishing up the last of our second unit. There will be daily questions and assignments

Chemistry I I U – Ms. Xu: We will continue Chapter 3 after March Break. On Tuesday, students will present their brochures and demonstrate the safe use of household products. If the demonstration is lengthy, a video presentation may be used instead.

Co-operative Education – Mr. Haklander: Students have finished their first in-class assignment and the presentations went well. Our next in-class day is March 28.

English IIC - Miss Hiemstra: This week, we concluded our novel study and began writing essays on *The Cellist of Sarajevo*. In light of snow days, the due date for the final essay submission (which also includes evidence of brainstorming, an outline, and a peer-edited rough draft) will be moved to Thursday, March 20. We will not have more inclass work periods on this essay after this week, so students are encouraged to complete this over the break. After the break, we'll be moving on to our unit on Short Stories!

English I I U – Mrs. Vandermeyden: Find some time to make good progress on your short stories over the break. We will work on revising and editing our short stories when we get back. Final drafts are due on Friday, March 28. We will also be starting a unit on Cry the Beloved Country this week. Students will be creating a documentary on a community-building organization in their communities. It would be good to think of an idea for an organization and an interview over the March break!

English 12C – Mrs. Vandermeyden: We will focus on characters and theme as we read through *The Hiding Place* by Corrie ten Boom.

English 12U – Mr. Ellens: The final draft of the Essay on Macbeth is due on Tuesday the 18th. We will begin our second unit on poetry seminars on Monday. Groups that have not finished their drama presentation will complete them on Monday the 17th.

Entrepreneurship: Venture Planning in an Electronic Age – Mr. Pennings: Students have been studying the labour markets in the 21st century. We have investigated the historical background, changes, and the impact of digital technology on the labour market. Students are just started to develop their venture plan for the culminating assignment.

French II – Mrs. Bergsma: Excellent work on the imperative tense and object pronouns, ladies! We are close to finishing up the content of this unit. The girls wrote a quiz on Friday and peer edited their paragraphs on a Francophone city. Girls, please work on your final projects during the break. After the break, we will peer edit those projects and prepare for the test. Have a wonderful break!

Mathematics 12C – Mrs. VanWynsberghe: We are beginning our second unit on statistics and data management, where we will be creating our own surveys and administering them to the school.

Physics 12U – Ms. Xu: After March Break, we will begin Chapter 4. On Monday, March 17, 2025, we will conduct the experiment, and students will complete the second part of the Chapter 2 test.

World History since the Fifteenth Century II – Miss Averink: Students wrote their Unit 2 test today. We will move to our unit on Colonialism and Imperialism after the March break. Students should be complete their research for the Biography Assignment – if not they should work on those over the break. These are due on Friday, March 21st. Have a great March break!
